
Congestion Pricing is foundational to the Capital Program

2020-2024 Capital Program Funding Plan (\$ in millions)






With the lawsuits, it's at risk



On the merits, MTA is confident

The environmental review and community outreach were extremely thorough.



The 3,000+ page Environmental Assessment thoroughly examined possible impacts

The MTA held more than X public meetings and got more than 27,000 public comments



But with any lawsuit comes risk

The MTA can't award contracts until the funding is fully secure.

As a result, we have stopped issuing new procurements, with limited exceptions.

This delay impacts the entire system

While funding is delayed, so are key projects throughout the Capital Program, including:

- Accessibility
- State of Good Repair
- Rolling Stock
- Zero-Emissions Buses
- Signal Modernization
- Second Avenue Subway Phase 2

The historic ADA settlement is predicated on full funding for the program.



Signal Modernization


More than **1.5 million daily riders** are waiting for signal upgrades & state of good repair work on the AC and BDFM trains.

Even as we start the Early Works, future contracts need congestion pricing.








